HONORING WORLD AIDS DAY HISTORY



World AIDS Day is on December 1st of every year since 1988. This international day of solidarity was started by two World Health Organization (WHO) members.

This day is meant to be a day where those affected by HIV around the world can unite by sharing their experiences, remembering and honoring those they've lost, stand together to fight HIV and stigma and reflect on how far medical advancements and treatment have come.

The first known cases of AIDS were reported in 1981 and though that was over 40 years go, HIV/AIDS still remains a public health challenge.
